3 children in nursery, 8 in Reception and 6 new children across Year 2, Year 4 and Year 6.



#### THANK YOU

You will have noticed the smart and tidy new garden border at the front of the school, the cleared landscaped bank by the car park. The playground blackboards have also been re-painted in addition to lots of other really useful repairs. We are very grateful for everyone's help to support us.

#### ACORN WASTE MANAGEMENT

We have worked in community partnership with Acorn Waste Management over the summer as part of their local project linked to the Queen's Platinum Jubiliee. St Lucia's school has been lucky to receive full support in providing us with newly constructed raised beds, one for each class. These are located on the school field by our running track and will be well used during the year. We will release a photo of thanks in next month's newsletter.

#### SCHOOL LUNCHES

All children in the Reception class, Year 1 and 2 continue to receive daily free school meals from the government funded Universal scheme. Children are provided with a choice of meals each morning which are made fresh to order by our school kitchen staff Mrs Alexander and Mrs Pye.

If your child is now in Year 3 upwards, children can still choose a hot lunch, but for a cost of £2.40 per day. Please bring cash or a cheque made payable to Shropshire Council in a labelled envelope with your child's name and the amount and days of lunches required. We asked that this is paid in advance as lunches can not continue to be provided if there are outstanding arrears.

#### **BRITISH FOOD FORTNIGHT**

#### LUNCH MENUS

New lunch menus will continue to be available on our school website shortly. These are arranged in three week blocks. We ask that parents support us with school lunches as much as possible to help keep sustainability of the service, particularly with rising food costs. To support parents, the governors have kept the price of school lunches the same at £2.40 per day.

#### AUTUMN TERM TOPIC

The topic for all classes this term is 'Our Wonderful World'. Within this learning we will focus on the environment and continue our Eco work. More information will be shared relating to class coverage via our class website pages this term.

#### PARENT QUESTIONNAIRES
