We would encourage all families to check if you meet the criteria for the Pupil Premium funding. Pupils eligible will receive free school meals throughout their time in school. Additional funding will also be allocated to school; this will enable us to provide further support and resources, as well as funding towards clubs and trips for children who are eligible.

The government will continue to provide schools with additional funding to support or enhance the learning of pupils who are currently, or have been, entitled to free school meals within the last six years. It's essential that parents/carers apply for free school meals even if the pupil doesn't wish to receive a free school meal.
